9 And when I was present with you, and wanted, oI was chargeable to no man: for that which was lacking to me pthe brethren which came from Macedonia supplied: and in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself.

10 As the truth of Christ is in me, "no man shall stop me of this boasting in the regions of Achaia.

11 Wherefore? 'because I love you not? God knoweth.

12 But what I do, that I will do, "that I may cut off occasion from them which desire occasion; that wherein they glory, they may be found even as we.
